

## LOCAL RULES, ORDINANCES, AND STATUTES

Many of the issues affecting priority issues can be addressed in part through administration of statutory responsibilities and ordinances. As part of Plan Section 5, and to meet [BWSR 1W1P Plan Content Requirements](#), the plan must “describe existing regulations, controls, and authorities relevant to water management for the purposes of highlighting areas of duplication, gaps, and opportunities. Use this analysis to identify areas to maximize effectiveness and build efficiencies through improved coordination and consistent application of regulations, and/or to develop new regulation or enforcement in support of meeting plan goals.”
