RE:     Redetermination of Benefits

**NOTICE OF HEARING**

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Annotated (M.S.A.) 103E.351, and other applicable statutes, the Board of Managers, Buffalo-Red River Watershed District (BRRWD), hereafter referred to as the "drainage authority", has completed a redetermination of benefits for Clay County Ditch Nos. 9, 32, and 33. The drainage authority determined that the original benefits did not reflect reasonable present day land values, and that benefited areas have changed since the original ditches were installed. The drainage authority appointed three Viewers to redetermine and report the new benefit rates and areas for each system.

A description of proposed property benefited and damaged by Clay County Ditch Nos. 9, 32, and 33 is hereby attached as Exhibit 1. Exhibit 2 is the names of the owners of the noted property, listed in narrative form.

The hearing for the redetermination of benefits and any other such matters deemed appropriate by the drainage authority will be held in accordance with M.S.A. 103E.335, on **Thursday, April 9, 2015, at 7:30 PM**, in the 1st Floor Council Chambers, City Hall, 500 Center AVE, Moorhead, MN.

The proposed Viewers' Reports for the drainage systems were filed with the drainage authority on March 9, 2015, and are available for inspection at the BRRWD office, 1303 4th AVE NE, Barnesville, MN, during regular business hours.

The Viewers can meet with landowners on **Tuesday, April 7, 2015, from 1:00 PM – 4:00 PM in Meeting Room B**, Third Floor, Clay County **Court House**, 807 11TH ST N, Moorhead, MN. This meeting will allow landowners to have more time to meet with the Viewers, review the maps, and benefit rates.

All persons interested and affected by these matters are required to appear before the drainage authority at the specified time, date, and location, to show cause, if any you may have, why said redetermined benefits should not replace the original benefits, and benefited areas in all subsequent proceedings relating to said drainage systems.

Following the hearing and the drainage authority's Final Order, persons aggrieved by the redetermination of benefits may appeal from the Order pursuant to M.S.A. 103E.091.
